Established in 1974, the Fund raises money which is invested in authorised charitable funds, the interest from which is applied to the repair and renewal of church bells in the Diocese of Oxford. The Fund is often able to indicate a provisional grant very early in a project's life - often before a faculty is obtained - providing much needed encouragement and impetus at the start of such a major undertaking. ### 10 Bell Practice at St Mary Magdalen (10) 7cwt

On the same day as the Iffley practice, there was another practice in the evening on the lovely little bells of St Mary Magdalen in the centre of Oxford. The two less experienced ringers who came along, were able to enjoy Plain Hunting Caters, and call changes, while the rest of us

rang Surprise Minor and Major methods. This was originally a wooden Saxon church which stood here a thousand years ago, but was burnt down in 1074. Robert D'Oyley, the Norman Constable of Oxford, built a single aisle chapel to replace the wooden church. Saint Hugh, the Bishop of Lincoln, rebuilt the church in 1194. Following



the English Reformation, the church's patronage passed from St Frideswide's to Christ Church. In 1841-42, George Gilbert Scott, then young and unknown, rebuilt the chancel and the north aisle. This complemented his Martyrs Memorial, just north of the church. It was the first Victorian Gothic interior in Oxford. **Paul Lucas.**
