St Frideswide is Oxford's patron saint. Legend has it that she lived in the early eighth century, escaped from an arranged marriage by hiding in reeds by the river and fulfilled her wish to become a nun by founding a great priory, close to the southern wall of Oxford where monks and nuns praised God and cared for those stricken by misfortune, and where her name lived on for ever. It was destroyed in 1002. However, the oldest monument in Christ Church Cathedral is the Shrine of St. Frideswide in the Latin Chapel north of the chancel. In 1289, the shrine once contained the holy relics of Frideswide and was visited by countless medieval pilgrims.

St Frideswide's church is on the Botley Road and is one of only two dedicated to the saint. The enclosed southern turret contains one bell, 14", hung for chiming. It was cast by Messrs Warner and is inscribed: London 1871. In the central tower is a disused bell, 13", inscribed: Mears & Stainbank Founders 1873. There is also a modern sanctuary bell, 4½", hung for chiming. The inscription reads: VOCEM MEAM AVDIT QUI ME TANGIT.

There are other bells in our branch dedicated to St Frideswide. Where are they?
