**St Martin's Church** in Bladon near Woodstock, is the Church of England parish church of Bladon with Woodstock. It is also the mother church of St Mary Magdalene at Woodstock, which was originally a chapel of ease. It is best known for the graves of the Spencer Churchill family, including Sir Winston Churchill, in its churchyard. I can remember being taken to see Churchill's grave as a young boy, when it was still covered in floral wreaths sent from many of the world's greatest leaders at the time. The queue to see the grave stretched right round the village, and it was a very moving occasion.
