Roy Jones Memorial in Old Marston

Saturday 15th August had dawned fine and sunny in Old Marston as a large group of Roy Jones' friends and relatives walked quietly over Mortimer Field to witness the unveiling of a plaque in Roy's memory. *Salix* was Roy's favourite tree and the plaque is placed close to the sturdy young willow planted earlier in tribute. Sharing memories verbally and in silence, we were uplifted by hearing Roy's own words in a poem he wrote when nine years old:

In the waters fish abound

And water lilies there are found

Roy Jones Memorial Ringing Morning at Islip (8) and Kidlington (8) – Saturday 22nd August

connotations by many, and on the last two Saturdays there has certainly been some good fortune in the splendid weather that has accompanied the two events to mark the strong legacy that has been left us by Roy Jones. Although the list of towers in and around Oxford alone that held a special significance to Roy is as long as the longest proverbial arm, **Islip** would unquestionably have been on the list as he rang over one hundred quarter peals on the bells. His quarter peal tally at **Kidlington** was considerably lower, but nonetheless this was still an oft visited tower for him. Despite being known for his prodigious level of quarter pealing Roy was also a great espouser of passing on the baton by way of opening out the opportunities to ring and with that in mind the morning was structured to encompass all who attended. All this has been brought about by the fact that back in the 1960s when there had been another restoration project, the builders of the day had used concrete and cement when replacing the damaged stonework, and as a result, over the years, the façade of the tower has been damaged. This 1960s stonework is to be removed and traditional stone will be replaced. The builders will also be renovating the clock on the tower. Meanwhile, ringing continues as normal, but some of the wedding photographers in recent weeks have been marginally less than happy that their traditional photographs of the happy couple standing in front of the lovely porch have had to be relocated!
