A Quarter Peal on the newly refurbished bells at Marston on Sunday 13th December

After a break of almost exactly five months, the villagers of Old Marston were able to start their Sunday morning with the familiarity of a quarter peal emanating from the tower. The unanimous opinion, ranging from the organist to those summoned to worship, was that the bells are unmistakably more harmonious after their refurbishment. This is a great relief as Marston bells peal more regularly than just about any other six bell tower in the world, with some 1,500 or so quarter peals having been rung on them and approaching 200 peals (virtually all of these being since World War Two), this alongside the practising and general service ringing that takes place. **Hugh Deam**

Next Year's Oxford City Branch Striking Competition

At the AGM last month, there was a good discussion about the future of the Striking Competition. It was decided that the format needed to change, to make it a more inclusive day for all Oxford City Branch members.

Here is a summary of what was agreed:

The striking competition will still be held on the same day as the half yearly meeting – in 2016, this will be **Saturday 14th May**, and the venue is likely to be **Old Marston (6)**, but this will be confirmed in the New Year.

The more formal competition for entry into the Guild Six Bell Competition will be on the same day.

There will also be an informal competition, for tower bands, or individuals from the City Branch, who can ring rounds, call changes or a method.

There will be relaxed rules – the informal competition is designed to allow people of all abilities to have fun ringing together.

For the individuals who want to take part there will be a draw a couple of months ahead. This will allow teams to have a chance to get together and practice if they want to. It's the ideal opportunity to meet ringers from other towers and try some different bells.

When the call for entries comes out, we will ask if people are able to call changes or conduct a method, so we can ensure all teams have someone capable of doing this.

People will be drawn to ring in one team, except where the numbers don't add up to 6, 12 etc, in which case some names will be drawn twice to make sure everyone who wants to ring can be included in a team.

We have also kindly been offered the use of a mini ring (pictured right), which is owned by Tony Crabtree, the new Guild Representative for Oxford City.

In order for this event to be a success, we need the support of as many branch members as possible, so please put 14th May in your diaries, and come along to support the day. **Lindsay Powell**
